




Who are Lake Service Providers?


Getting A Permit

One permit per business covers:

- A business
- A business owner
- Employees who complete employee certificate training

Three steps to get a permit
1. pay \$50 application & testing fee
2. complete the training
3. pass the test

Permit and Permit Stickers





What to do with the Permit

- Read and sign permit. The permit is not in effect until signed.
- Keep a copy in possession while providing services.
- Give copies to employees working under the permit.
- ♥Place a service provider sticker on the driver's side windshield of each vehicle you use to provide services.
- ❷Produce the permit if requested by a Conservation Officer or DNRauthorized inspector.

Employee Training and Certificate

- Take online training and pass test
- Paper version available (takes longer)
- Print copy and carry while working
- Certificate good for 3 years


Initial Training Structure
